Fly of the Month: Carey Special

As we find ourselves in the middle of some fantastic Adirondack trout pond fishing this fly of the month choice takes us to the western part of the US and Canada for a favorite Stillwater pattern. The Carey Special is easy to tie and represents a wide array of pond food for trout. Especially true for matching pre emergent Hexagenia mayflies that occur now through mid-July weather permitting. On the bottom is where this fly needs to be fished to be effective – nice and slow with an occasional short strip should do it. Hook: 6-10 nymph hook – long shank; Thread; black 6/0; Weight: few wraps of lead; Tail: long pheasant rump feathers; Rib: fine gold wire; Body: peacock herl; Hackle: same as tail. Mount hook and then the weight and attach the tying thread. Tie in the tail fibers and then the rib and body. Wrap the body forward leaving a bit of room for the hackle and then wrap the rib to the same spot and tie off. A few wraps of the hackle and tie off should do it. This fly can also be tied with varying hackle and body colors such as olive and black. Enjoy.
