shrubs for planting along the tributary
streams in the Hudson River Estuary
watershed. We are looking for new sites for
plantings. Our staff can help you create a
planting plan and work with your volunteers
on-site during planting.

Trees for Tribs is now accepting

applications for Spring 2015 planting projects. Watershed groups, land trusts, and other environmental organizations are encourage to apply. Applications received by March 1, 2015will be given preference.

Since 2007, Trees for Tribs has been responsible for planting more than 36,000 native trees and shrubs along 17 miles of stream with the help of over 7,500 local volunteers. These plants will help protect water quality, fish and wildlife and also reduce erosion and flooding.

Fish of the Month 2015 Contest in Full Gear

The Chapter's Fish of the Month Contest is already in its sixth year having crowned **Rich Atkinson**, **Noe Mead**, **Jim Berry**, **Bill Bach**, **Ron Boutin** and for 2013, **Brad Mohr**, as winners in its first six years.

All the entries for 2014's contest are in and the winner will be announced at the Clearwater Banquet on March 14. The entire editorial staff is carefully scrutinizing all the photos from last year to come up with best of the best for 2014!

The contest is open to all members (except me!) and family members of Chapter members and is not necessarily based on the biggest fish, but the quality of the fish, story behind it and picture quality all make up a winning entry. Simply send a photograph to me at my email address at mrbrownie6@gmail.com or contact me via email for my mailing address if you have a Polaroid or 35mm shot. As the entries come I'll publish them in the newsletter and select a winner at the March Banquet when the winner will get a dozen hand tied flies or something else really nice as a prize.

For March 2015 there were no entries.

Fly of the Month: Vladi's Woven Polish Nymph

This fly is a must have for any serious Czech nympher. This is nothing more than a woven grub by the looks of it. With two tones and a tungsten bead and a super slim profile to give it a faster sink rate, the fly rotates in the water giving the fish a look at the two tones flashing before them and entices strikes from even the most stubborn trout.

Vladi Trzebunia of Poland and the Polish Flyfishing team designed this pattern to win the World Fly Fishing Championships in 1989. That year, with this fly and the newly created method of fishing known today as Polish nymphing, Vladi caught more fish by himself than the next three ranked teams combined. If that doesn't speak for the fly and this technique, then I don't know what does. From that day on, the Polish nymphing technique (later altered by the Czech team and now known throughout the flyfishing world as Czech nymphing) has ruled the waters during most flyfishing competitions.

The youtube.com version at https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=4XyHNZfb3Vk is one of several online videos that can help you tie the woven style that makes this fly unique. Hook: curved nymph hook 6-18; Thread: 6/0 matches body; Underbody: pearl mylar flash; Body: two strands of ultra wire (different colors for two toned look); Thorax: dubbing – color your choice, but gray, olive, brown, black are good choices; Bead: color or size to match hook. Mount the bead and then tie in the tying thread. Tie in the two body wires starting just behind the bead to make sure they are tight and wrap them back to the curve of the hook. Add the underbody and then tie off the thread behind the bead and cut off as we'll come back to it later. The forming of the body with the wire is very easy if you watch the video, but difficult for me to explain here. Once finished watching the video and finishing the body of the fly reattach the tying thread and dub in a thorax. There are countless combinations of colors and materials (wire isn't the only material that can be used – yarn, zlon are good too) to make this fly work well. Google search for images of this fly and you'll see a lot of different colors and materials being used. Combined with some online video instruction on how to Czech nymph you'll increase your catch rate for sure.
