Clearwater Chapter General Meeting

September 21, 2015 is the date for the next Chapter meeting. Clearwater Trout Unlimited will hold its monthly meeting at the Ramada Plaza Hotel in Albany (just off Everett Rd). September's speaker is **Stuart Bartow** and his new book **Teaching Trout to Talk**.

The presentation will be in three parts. First, he'll discuss how the book came to be created. Next he'll read certain short chapters, and last he will take questions for discussion. **Teaching Trout to Talk** is published by RA Press, and retails for \$15. It can be ordered from Barnes and Noble, Amazon, and bookstores in the region, or directly from RA Press if anyone wants to read a copy beforehand. Books will also be available at the presentation.

Stuart Bartow is a Chancellor's Award winning professor of English at SUNY Adirondack where he also directs

the college's Writers Project. He has published several books of poetry, and his non-fiction work, Teaching Trout to Talk: the Zen of Small Stream Fly Fishing, won this year's Adirondack Center for Writing Best Book of Non-Fiction Award. He is also chair of the Battenkill Conservancy and a member of the Clearwater Chapter of TU. He lives in Salem, a great place for anyone who likes fishing.

Upper Saranac Lake Boat Launch Improvements

DEC has constructed five additional parking spaces for vehicles and trailers at the recently renovated Upper Saranac Lake Boat Launch in the Town of Santa Clara, Franklin County.

The boat launch, one of only two public boat launches that provide access to Upper Saranac Lake, is located on the north end of the lake at the intersection of Franklin County Road 46 and Back Bay Road.

Improvements to the boat launch completed this spring include a paved parking area and a flatter slope to access the new boat ramp. The new floating docks allow boaters to more easily enter and leave their boats. Upgrades to the bathroom facility and significant improvements to the landscaping provide a more pleasant experience for those using boat launch.

A boat rinse station is available to boaters to flush out bilges, live wells and other water containing areas and equipment. Boat launch stewards, hired and trained by Paul Smiths College, will show arriving boaters the signs of possible invasive threats on their watercraft and trailers.

As part of the effort to prevent the spread of aquatic invasive species DEC regulation requires boaters to remove all visible plant and animal materials from boats, trailers and associated equipment, and to drain boats prior to launching at or departing from DEC lands.

The \$474,000 renovation project was funded through New York Works.

Fly of the Month: Micro Nymph tied with Hends Body Quill

'Tis the season to fish skinny water to selective fish who have outsmarted anglers and god knows what else all year. This month we feature a micro nymph tied with a great body material called Hends Body Quill. This nymph is a 5 minute creation designed to get down to bottom dwellers in fast water. Can anyone say grayling or Ausable? This nymph is tied in very small sizes and for the angler wishing to have a fly that can be easily tied in the micro sizes in a variety of colors this is a great addition to the box. It is natively in French, but your internet browser should allow for a translation and when you do this site is dedicated to “peche a vue” or in English – sight fishing. Using tiny nymphs that quietly enter the shallowest of water is the key to catching wary spring creek or low water trout. Excellent in fast water this time of the year also as this fly drops like a brick. And don't forget to use this as a dropper fly or a multi fly rig. If you need some body quill or other great supplies try this website: <http://www.tungsten-beads-plus.com/products/hends-body-quills> - there are others, but this one offered loads of information. **Hook:** Maruto D82 BL #16 or Demmon DSN 120 BL in size #18 or #20 is what the original, but I have tied these using tiny Mustad nymph hooks; **Body Thread:** Demmon Thread Hot Spot Orange – I substituted other colored thread – this fly can be tied in a variety of colors and I would suggest olive, tan, brown; **Tying thread:** 17/0 is the original, but all I had was 8/0 and 12/0 – the smaller the easier, but 8/0 was ok; **Body:** Hends Body Quill – variety of colors and I would stick with olive, tan, brown; **Tail:** coq del leon – I used a few partridge fibers; **Bead:** 2.5mm gold tungsten – size is important here or it won't go on, but other colored beads should be tried; **Thorax:** nymph dubbing. Add the bead to the hook and mount in the vise. Start wrapping the body thread behind the bead and wrap towards the hook bend and back creating a tapered body. Tie off when done. Tie in the tying thread near the bend of the hook and tie in the tail and body thread. Once done wrap the tying thread forward to just behind the bead and then wrap the body quill forward creating a segmented look and tie off behind the bead. Add a small thorax behind the bead and tie off. Best of luck!
